Thank you for choosing The Islamic Education School for your child. For more than two decades our school has serviced the Muslim Community in Philadelphia and surrounding counties. In shaa' Allāh, this will be a wonderful learning experience for both your child and your family. The following information is important to help you and your child have a successful year. Please read each section and initial indicating that the items was explained to you and that you accept.

1. Our school has a mandatory orientation meeting at the end of each summer. You will receive information about those dates, In shaa' Allāh, by the beginning of July. Again, this orientation is a requirement for admission into the school.
2. In our school, we teach according to the madhhab of Imām ash-Shāfi'īyy. While we acknowledge the permissibility of following any of the other rightly guided schools (Madhhabs) such as Malikiyy and Hambaliyy, to avoid confusion in our school, we teach according to the school of Imām ash-Shāfi'īyy. We also teach and encourage the Sunnah matters.
3. A successful school year is dependent upon the commitment of the student, family and school. We are committed to doing our best to provide your child with the strongest academic and Islamic education. We'll need your commitment in supporting the efforts of your child by working with us and keeping up with the communications from school. This includes attending parent/teacher conferences, participating in school events, and fulfilling your volunteer requirement.
4. Adherence to the TIES school uniform policy is mandatory. The information regarding our uniform and where to purchase your student's uniform will be sent to you. This policy will be explained to you in detail. I understand the policy, and will ensure my child's compliance.
5. At TIES, we strive to educate Muslims who will be productive members of society. In keeping with this commitment, we will have opportunities where your child may be called upon to assist with community service events, assist older members of our community, help clean their classroom, set up for events, or assist younger students.
6. TIES is a school that puts the best interest of the child first, so we are unable to take children with known behavioral issues or special needs depending on the extent of the IEP. By enrolling your child, you are acknowledging that your child does not have any known behavioral issues or special needs that may require resources we are unable to provide.
7. TIES is a private tuition-based institution. We provide a service for an annual fee. This fee is due by the 1st day of school. However, a payment arrangement may be made available upon your request. This arrangement includes 1) a deposit and 2) monthly payments totaling the remaining balance. Timely payments are necessary for our school's operation. Delinquency is grounds for termination or suspension of our services to your student. If your family experiences financial hardship, it is your responsibility to contact our office to seek permission for a payment extension or restructuring. By enrolling your child into TIES, you are acknowledging that tuition must be paid monthly or risk cessation of services.

8. At TIES, during the month of Ramadan, all children --- seven lunar years and older are required to fast unless there is a valid religious excuse.
9. At TIES, we do not celebrate any non-Islamic holidays, or celebrate birthdays in any manner that imitates the non-Muslims as it is not amongst the habit of the Muslims.
